On Monday 22 October 2012, thirty two AS students embarked on a Geography fieldtrip to Pembrokeshire, in order to investigate regeneration of rural areas and the pressures on a developing coastline. Every student was a credit to Highdown with James Nicholson and Laura Crew each winning top Geographer of the week.

All students demonstrated an excellent work ethic, collecting data and interviewing locals to build a fantastic understanding of the local area in preparation for their upcoming examination in January 2013. Day one and two were spent exploring rural areas to evaluate the effectiveness of rebranding schemes aimed at reinventing and improving the area. On



day three they undertook a spectacular coastal walk discovering the processes and management techniques at work along the Pembrokeshire coastline and finally, it would not be a Geography fieldtrip without measuring hundreds of pebbles in order to discover the direction of long shore drift.

Year 9 Rugby Final



On Monday 19 November 2012, Highdown's Year 9 Rugby team played Hugh Faringdon in the League Final, as Highdown had won the Reading West League and Hugh Faringdon had won the East League. It was twelve against fifteen players in Hugh Faringdon's favour due to four forgotten kits. Despite this Highdown took an early lead after a try from Mo Tahir which was quickly followed by three tries from Hugh Faringdon to give them a 15-5 lead after only ten minutes. It would have been easy to give up, but the whole team dug deep and scored two quick tries by Colm McAdden, which he converted to give Highdown a narrow 19-15 half time lead. In the second half we expected to tire being three players short, but instead we upped our game and scored four more tries against one of theirs to win the game 39-20. Colm completed his hat trick and the

two joint men of the match scored the other three, Tom Willis and Matt Simmons. Well done boys.

They came back to earth in the next game losing 10-5 to Theale despite a good try by Alex Audland, but bounced back again with a 5-0 win over Maiden Erlegh, with a try from Ed after a great pass from Jack, which set up a final league game against the unbeaten Wargrave Piggott. Highdown played brilliantly



and in a stormy game ended up victors 14-0 after two great team tries scored by Jardel James and converted by Ed.
