The White Queen, Philippa Gregory — more great historical fiction	A good place to start and to immerse yourself in the period leading up to Henry VI is to watch the three episodes of <i>The Plantaganets</i> on Dailymotion — the first episode is called 'the Devil's Brood'. This covers the 300 years of Plantagenet rule before Henry VI and will cover things you studied in Year 7. It sets the scene for medieval kingship.  **Britain's Bloody Crown**, available on Youtube**, is the story of our period up to Henry VII.
