Year 7! You have been set the challenge to complete your Pixl Edge Apprentice Level by the end of Year 7. In order to complete this you must have completed X2 activities/challenges for each of the **LORIC** skills: Leadership, Organisation, Resilience, Initiative and Communication.

At home: You should be completing the challenge/ task you have set yourself.

During Mentor time (Wed/Thurs): You should be completing your descriptions and evaluations. Discussing these with your mentor to ensure they get approved and completed!

Welcome to the Edge

The PiXL Edge is a framework for schools to develop and accredit in students those personal attributes essential for employability and life.

The scheme will focus on five key attributes:

- Leadership (red)
- Organisation (green)
- Initiative (purple)
- Resilience (blue)
- Communication (yellow)

Students will qualify at three levels:

Level 1: PiXL Apprentice

Level 2: PiXL Graduate

Level 3: PiXL Master

At each level there are a variety of approved activities that students can undertake for each of the key attributes, the number of activities that need to be completed varies depending on the level (1).



By the end of Year 7..

You should have completed the Apprentice Level...

You must show evidence that you have completed X2 tasks for each of the five key attributes:

- Leadership
- Organisation
- Initiative
- Resilience
- Communication

At Home: You should be undertaking challenges and tasks to demonstrate you have achieved the challenges you've chosen for each LORIC skill.

In mentor time: You should be writing out your descriptions and evaluations, discussing with your mentor how your doing in order for them to be signed off and completed!

- Graduate** 8 activities (1 for each key attribute and 3 additional of your choice)
- Master** 6 activities (1 for each key attribute and 1 additional of your choice)

Student activities database

When a student chooses to select an activity they will complete a short form that asks:

- Describe your activity, mention what you are going to do and how you are planning to achieve it?
- Target completion date. Once a student has completed the form and committed to undertake the activity the lead teacher is informed via their teacher view. When a student has selected an activity their individual progress bar will show this via the relevant shaded colour.

When a student believes they have completed an activity they will complete a short evaluation form and submit this for verification. This will trigger an alert on the teacher view (shown by a warning explanation mark symbol next to the students name).

The student evaluation will include:

- what they have learnt from the activity
- the location and nature of the evidence if required.

On receiving a student's submission that they have completed an activity, the lead teacher will then assess that this has taken place and consult the evidence if needed.

Successfully completed activities will be shown on the student login page by the progress bar – each attribute is colour coded so easy for students to see what they need to do. If the activity has been completed then the colour is bold, if the activity has just been selected and not completed then it is a faded colour.

Student progress will also be shown on the teacher summary page, which lists all students and their progress.


