
This process assumes **neither the parent nor the student** currently have @outlook.com accounts setup with Microsoft, although an existing account may be used if preferred.


Highdown recommend **creating a parental account first** during the initial setup. This serves two purposes: It provides admin rights to the parent and allows parental controls to be applied to the device, and it ensures that two accounts are present on the device in the case of forgotten passwords or account corruptions.



These instructions were created using a Acer Device so some screen options may vary when run on other hardware such as HP, Dell, Lenovo etc.

These instructions were created when setting up a Windows 10 device as predominantly these are the devices currently in service with students at Highdown School. Screen shots may vary slightly when followed using a Windows 11 device.

Windows 11 Upgrade – Microsoft are ending security updates and software patches for Windows 10 at the end of **October 2025**. The upgrade to Windows 11 is **FREE**, instructions for this process are on the Highdown Website.

Everyone using a Windows PC or Laptop have experienced the inevitable slow down after extended periods of time as files build up on devices over a few years. Whilst your Windows 10 device may have the option to simply migrate to Windows 11, we ask you consider taking this opportunity to refresh your child's device using the Factory Reset instructions *before* completing the update to Windows 11. This will leave the device running faster and increase its longevity for the coming years.
