



Course Requirements

- Minimum is 5 passes at GCSE, including English and Maths
- Subjects usually have their own specific entry requirements
- EPQ and Core Maths available

- Guidance and support for competitive subjects and Oxbridge candidates





The Application Process



- Online application forms available from 5th November, and due in by 5th December 2025
- Interviews January to March
- Provisional offers made following interviews
- Induction at the end of June 2026
- Enrolment day on 20 August 2026
