Curriculum and assessment

The course is made up of three units:

Unit 1 – The Online World (Guided learning hours: 30)

You will explore a range of digital devices and software which drive business and communication in the online world.

Unit 3 – A Digital Portfolio (Guided learning hours: 30)

Develop a series of linked web pages to make use of multimedia assets you have created.

Unit 13 – Database Development (Guided learning hours: 60)

You will learn how we businesses from Facebook to Amazon use databases to store and search for information.

The assessment consists of a computer based external exam worth 25% of the unit while the remaining 75% comes from coursework-based portfolio that is completed during class time.
