Both live events are set to be really informative for students and I hope they enjoy them.



Textiles in the Spotlight of Careers



This week students of GCSE and A-Level Textiles took part in a Victoria and Albert Museum talk featuring London based designer Shanice Palmer. Her work is driven by the core belief of positive impact, through empowering individuals to unapologetically be the truest versions of themselves. Defining her designs as "rebel wear for royal souls." Each collection takes on a new perspective of what it means to be royal. Inspired by the worlds of fantasy and documentary her commitment to clothing and craftsmanship expresses her creativity, redefining what British craftsmanship looks like in the modern world. As a graduate of London College of Fashion, she was awarded as one of the ten "One to Watch" designers by Dezeen.

Students learnt about the process of entering the creative industries and what the next steps could be after Highdown. The students were given an insight to what it looks like to be a Fashion Designer and the challenges that were overcome by Shanice to be a successful designer.

Students had the opportunity to ask questions which were answered during the talk. Students are encouraged to further research into her work and potentially use it as Primary research for their upcoming projects.

The feedback from students was that they found it incredibly insightful and beneficial for them in making important decisions about their potential career aspirations within the Fashion industry!
