New for 2022, the event will be split into two sessions throughout the day, each with a different focus.

The Afternoon Session will run from 12:00 - 14:30 and will allow you to learn more about the different Russell Group universities. You will be able to take part in 5 live webinars in the virtual auditorium, view information and videos about each university, link directly to Virtual Campus Tours to explore university facilities and accommodation, and download prospectuses.

The Evening Session will run from 16:30 - 20:00, throughout this session you can visit individual booths and speak directly to their representatives and ambassadors using a text-based chat. Each university will also host live video sessions featuring an introductory webinar, followed by a live video Q&A session answering your specific questions.


