Guidance on Covid for the winter months

Please be advised the current guidance from the UK Government for children and young people is as follow:

If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults. Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

Science Enrichment




Oxford University Museum of Natural History will be running another series of Natural History Investigator sessions in January 2023.

Duke of Edinburgh's Award



A record number of Highdown students have completed their Bronze DofE award and have collectively volunteered over 1000 hours supporting projects which benefit the local community. This alone is merit worthy, but every single participant embarking on this aspirational award makes a commitment to become more physically active, develop new skills and make a positive contribution to society.

This year participants planned and completed a two-day overnight hiking expedition in the Chiltern hills, carrying everything they would need on their backs and navigating unfamiliar terrain as a team. Those who completed the expedition will all have stories to tell and examples of leadership, resilience and teamwork when they start to attend interviews in the near future. The DofE award is considered the most valuable, non-academic qualification by both Universities and Employers for good reason.

This year we have made changes to how the award is delivered, to help ensure we can offer a place to every Highdown student who wishes to participate. We will now be working with Path Hill Adventures to run training and assessment for our expeditions. This change brings many new opportunities such as allowing participants to begin their journey in year 9 and providing access higher levels of the award.

Students who were lucky enough to join us at Rhos-Y-Gwaliau already have some experience of Gold level DofE expeditions and we look forward to them taking on the challenges of the DofE award this year.

The details for enrolling on the award were distributed via ClassCharts earlier this week and we look forward to welcoming the new cohort of participants.

Residential Insight into University

Summer Schools 2023

Insight into University residential courses (previously known as Headstart) are summer schools run over 4 or 5 days where students get a taster of university life and an insight into a specific STEM subject. Students will get the opportunity to experience university style lectures and work on activities and group projects with the support of academics and student mentors. Students will stay in halls of residence and will take part in social activities in the evenings.

These courses are for Year 12/S5-6 students and are a great way to try out a STEM subject at university before applying. This allows students to make a better informed decision for their UCAS application, as well as meeting like-minded students from all over the UK.

These summer schools are run for small groups (on average 30 students) and so places are limited.

Applications open on the 3rd of October 2022 and will close on the 3rd of January 2023.

There will be something for everyone including advice and guidance on progressing to university, further education, apprenticeships and traineeships. There will also be presentations on volunteering and gap years.






