Coughs and colds in young children

The Royal Berkshire NHS Foundation Trust (RBFT) has launched its winter campaign about coughs and colds in young children and, in particular, Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV). The campaign is focused on parents looking after young children at home and knowing when to seek help. Advice about <u>coughs and colds in children</u> can be found on the NHS website and there is a short video about RSV on the RBFT YouTube channel.

Guidance on Covid for the winter months

Please be advised the current guidance from the UK Government for children and young people is as follow:

If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults. Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

Clinical Pharmacology BSc: How clinical pharmacology transformed HIV infection from death sentence to liveable condition


