
Henri uses many complementary colours in his art. Colours are the main lead of his artwork. They are the most important.

I think that the artist Henri Matisse uses colours very well. He knows where to put them and how to use them.




Henri's art rem of picasso's art. This is because both use bright colours and lots of unique shapes.


His work is a bit crazy but it is good way. It reminds me of a colour paint pallet or rainbow squares all squashed up into a box.
