
We would like to encourage parents/carers to complete one of the following parent courses in National Online Safety, presented by Myleene Klass:

Last month, Theo and his teammates from his table tennis club also competed at the second round of the Junior British League, the highest league in table tennis for under 19s in the UK. They dominated the games and won the title for the Ninth Division convincingly. As the youngest player in the entire Junior British League, Theo played really well and achieved the second highest winning percentage in his division. He also earned Player of the Match for three out of the four games. Well done!

Year 7

This term our school liaison police officers, PC Packer and PC Marr, will be in school discussing issues around knife crime with year 7 mentor groups. These lessons are discussion based and will cover issues such as: what is knife crime, why might a young person carry a knife, what the law says and what the impacts/consequences of carrying a knife might be. There will also be a discussion around a report from the BBC about a knife crime incident involving a 16 year old.

These lessons will help students to understand why it is so important to not carry a knife or to feel pressured into doing so. It is part of our wider PSHCE curriculum aimed at helping our students make safe and healthy choices. Digital Learning and Innovation

Hello everyone and welcome to the first in a regular series of updates showcasing the school's use of digital technology in the classroom and beyond. As part of the school's Bring Your Own Device policy, students in Years 7 & 8 should come equipped with a fully-charged laptop to every school day; it's probably about time we shared news of some of the learning that's been going on as part of the policy! We'll also be looking at how Highdown has embraced digital learning in Key Stages 4 & 5 in future updates.

First up it's the turn of **Modern Foreign Languages** – our photo shows a Year 8 Spanish class working hard on the Language Gym platform (<u>https://uk.language-gym.com/</u>). The Language Gym is a highly interactive website which uses an extensive range of games to test all parts of a student's language learning – the 4 key skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing, as well as their learning of vocabulary.

Teachers can create assignments for classes to follow based on a particular level and topic, and the range of games means that students can make their own choices about how they practice and learn; a further benefit is that students can learn at their own pace, be that in the classroom or at home. Teachers can also use a report function to track student progress and success.

The Language Gym has a full range of activities available in all three of the languages taught at Highdown (Mandarin, Spanish and French) as well as a number of others, including Welsh and Malay! If your child has access to the Language Gym through school, why not ask them to show you how it works; hopefully they'll help you get addicted to the buzz of language learning online.


