



Answer to Numeracy Puzzle

C) Both A & B

Explanation: The given number puzzle can be solved in two ways.

Logic 1: Row 1 - 2 x 3 = 6, 6 x 3 = 18 Row 2 - 4 x 5 = 20, 20 x 5 = 100 Row 3 - 3 x 7 = 21, 21 x 7 = 147 Hence, the missing number could be 3.

Logic 2: Row 1 - 6 x (2+1) = 18 Row 2 - 20 x (4+1) = 100 Row 3 - 21 x (6+1) = 147 Hence, the missing number could be 6. Some of Highdown's Year 12 students are taking part in the Big Sleep Out on Saturday, 13 May, where they will spend a night sleeping on the school fields in order to raise awareness of what the homeless go through on a daily basis.
