Safeguarding: National Online Safety Courses for Parents and Carers



Firstly, the experience was amazing and very well organised which leads me onto thanking all the teachers that accompanied us, we are all very grateful. Also, I must thank all of the previous A level Music students who raised the money to finance our trip.

The performance itself was breath taking and extremely informative. The conductor showed us his favourite parts of the 3 movements and explained them in detail. For example, there was a section where the double basses really drove the piece with an interesting, yet simple rhythm. He also gave us some useful context like what the inspiration behind the piece was (which was one of John Adams' dreams, about a tank in water and it slowly rising above it, I believe). The uncut version of the piece was an incredible experience, every section played to perfection and all of it together was fabulous.

In short, the trip to the Barbican was great and we all would love to be able to do a trip like that again in the future.



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
