Home learning is an integral part of a student's learning and is used for: (1) promoting independent learning and time management skills, (2) consolidation, reinforcement and application of learning, (3) extending and developing learning, (4) developing research and investigative skills, (5) facilitating teacher assessment of understanding and learning, and/or (6) preparing for the following lesson, e.g. 'flipped learning'.

Years 10 and 11 can expect a minimum of 45-60 minutes per subject.

All home learning activities will be set on Class Charts, which is accessible via any web-enabled device in or out of school.
