

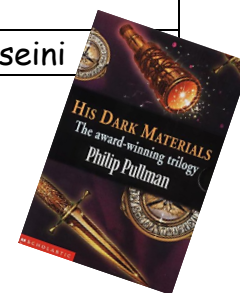
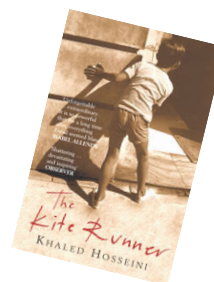

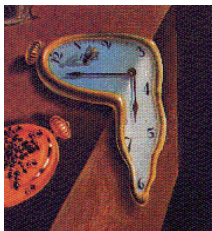

Reading? When do I get a chance to read?

You may find KS4 a little busier than KS3, with more demands on your time - so when are you going to find the time to read?

- **Waiting** - Always have a good book with you so that you don't miss a chance to read when waiting in a queue or when you are unexpectedly delayed!
- **Travelling** - A 15 minute bus / train ride to and from school adds up to 2 ½ hours of a good book each week. Make the most of it!
- **First thing in the morning** - If you are someone who is always up first in your house, spend some time reading, especially at weekends when you are not in a rush to get to school.
- **Before you go to sleep** - Reading is a great way to relieve yourself from some of the symptoms of stress which will become more obvious as the exams approach!
- **During the holidays** - This is the perfect time to enjoy reading when you have fewer pressures from school.
- **Turn off the TV** - Some of the greatest novels are better than any soap opera on British television. Just look at how many get turned into films (The Da Vinci Code by Dan Brown is a recent example of one) so give them a chance and before you realise it you will be hooked!
