

# Degree Apprenticeship in Civil Engineering

The BEng (Hons) Civil Engineering degree apprenticeship, which was developed in partnership with a group of employers, is an amazing new degree offering a debt-free path to a university education. Taught over four years, you'll be learning while working in an exciting civil engineering role. Your tuition fees for this degree will be paid for by your employer through the apprenticeship levy and, at the same time, you'll also be earning a competitive salary. Throughout your degree you'll have direct access to major civil engineering projects. On graduation, you'll receive a full BEng (Hons) degree and have gained four years' valuable work experience, putting you in a great position to move on in your career.

## *Why choose this apprenticeship?*

Our programme has been designed in collaboration with employers to satisfy the Apprenticeship Standard for a Civil Engineer. This is the employer-defined, government-approved standard of competence for an apprentice in this occupation. While elements of the degree will be studied during time at work, the majority of your tuition delivered in form of day release by University of West London academic staff.

Residential courses will be structured around your modules and will comprise lectures, seminars and workshops. During this time, you will also be able to meet one-to-one with your academic mentor. In addition to studying, these occasions will provide opportunities for you to spend time socialising with your peers.

## Eligibility

Eligibility is subject to Education and Skills Funding rules. You must have the right to work in England and be one of the following:

- A citizen of a country within the European Economic Area (EEA) (including other countries determined within the EEA or those with bilateral agreements), or have the right of abode in the UK, and have been ordinarily resident in the EEA (including other countries determined within the EEA or those with bilateral agreements), for at least the previous three years on the first day of learning.

OR

- a non-EEA citizen with permission from the UK government to live in the UK, (not for educational purposes) and have been ordinarily resident in the UK for at least the previous three years before the start of learning.

## Entry requirements

112 - 120 UCAS tariff points from Level 3 qualifications, including A Level Mathematics or equivalent.

Qualifications can include:

- A Levels at grade B, B and C, or above
- BTEC Extended Diploma with Distinction, Merit, Merit Access to HE Diploma.

## How to apply

To apply for this apprenticeship, you will need to find an employer who is offering it. The University of London cannot accept applications directly.
